Course Outline:

The Generic Manufacturing Skills (GMS) WSQ framework aims to raise the professionalism of the workforce. The Competency Unit aims to provide learners with the knowledge and skills in supervising scaffold erection, inspection and dismantling work activities in construction and other related industries.

Learning Objectives are:

- Set up, erection, inspection and dismantling of independent tied scaffold
- Perform erection, inspection, dismantling of frame scaffold, birdcage scaffold, tubular tower scaffold, aluminum tower scaffold, all-round system scaffold and cuplock system scaffold in accordance with the safe work procedures, general principles and requirements of *SS659, WSH (Scaffold) Regulations and other related WSH Regulations
- Identify hazards and ensure safety of scaffold erection and dismantling
- Record work in scaffold register and inspection checklists

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Assumed Skills and Knowledge:

- · Be above 18 years of age
- Have successfully completed the Metal Scaffold Erection Course. Proof of entry requirement includes the submission of Certificate of Successful Completion or WSQ Certificate of Attainment (SOA).
- Have Employability Skills (ES) Workplace Literacy level 4 and above.
- Be able to manipulate numbers at a proficiency level equivalent to ES Workplace Numeracy level 4 and above.

Certification:

A Statement of Attainment (SOA) will be awarded to successful participants.

Important note:

Participants are required to bring their personal document (i.e., NRIC, valid Work Permit or In-Principle Approval and Passport), personal protection protective equipment (i.e., Safety helmet, Safety shoes, Safety goggle and Safety gloves) and personal water bottle.
